

Sr. Belinda Monahan attended the national gathering of Benedictine Sisters who are 55 and under, held at Sacred Heart Monastery in Yankton, SD. The meeting is a time of sharing, relationship building, and mutual support, as well as spiritual, mental and physical renewal.



Through both the Republican and Democratic National Conventions, we joined with the Leadership Conference of Women Religious (LCWR) to pray for the discernment of delegates, voters, and elected officials; peace and non-violence in the process of nomination and election; and transformation for us all in this time of polarization and division. LCWR will host a virtual prayer space during election week November 4-6 at *lewr.org*.

Rogers Park/West Ridge Historical Society presented The Nuns on the Ridge: A Peek into the Archives of Benedictine Sisters of Chicago. Our Community Archivist Sr. Virginia Jung presented a brief history of the sisters and findings from her ongoing archival work. The society brought a potluck picnic, and after the presentation, attendees walked the labyrinth and toured the gardens.



Sr. Susan Kilduski lectured on Peace and Harmony in Cenobitic Monasticism at the Home of Harmony, as part of their ongoing series on world religions.
